

The Fascinating Tale of Beavers

The beaver –Oregon's state mascot and Canada's national symbol–is a beloved animal worldwide. But what makes them so special?

Although not the rarest, they remain one of the weirdest animals on the planet. You need to watch beavers build a dam to understand their uniqueness. However, there's much more to the beaver than tree gnawing and dam building. Join us as we take a closer look at the secret lives of one of the weirdest animals across North America.

Why You Should Give a Dam

Beavers are the largest rodent in North America, weighing up to 60 pounds (27 kilograms). It gives us an excellent example of evolutionary adaptation. They were giant Castoroides during the Ice Age—weird, eight-feet-long animals weighing over 200 pounds. They shrunk over the years to be the adept builder army we know today.

The semi-aquatic fuzz balls have valves in their nose and ears. They also feature a third set of transparent eyelids similar to goggles, and their lips close behind their teeth.

Castoroides of the past didn't have the iconic beaver tail, but now it has various purposes. The iconic tail acts as a rudder to help them swim and provides balance while they build their lodge. It also acts as a danger alarm when they slap it on the ground.

Beavers also boast some great innate survival tactics. For instance, one of the reasons they build a dam is to stop the water system behind it from freezing completely. This work allows them to feed and store food during the cold winter months.

The critters join the handful of animals who are monogamous. After a young male builds his beaver lodge, he'll find a mate to have a family that lives together. The world's largest beaver dam is located in Alberta, Canada, and is almost 3,000 feet (850 meters). It joins the list of wondrous things humans have found by accident via satellite images. Scientists believe that generations of the same beaver family are responsible for such a massive dam.

Interesting Facts

- Beavers can hold their breath for fifteen minutes.
- Beavers secrete a substance called castoreum that smells and tastes like vanilla. This chemical compound is an FDA-certified natural flavoring that perfume companies often include in their products. A Beaver Latte, anyone?
- Beaver's teeth are orange because their enamel contains iron, making them super strong, a crucial feature to building a dam.
- Beavers don't always build dams. Instead, if the water is deep enough to keep them safe from predators and stop ice from blocking the entrance, they live in bank burrows or create small lodges above the water.
- Their front teeth never stop growing. However, gnawing on wood prevents them from growing too long. If any issues occur, Mr. Weird is always on hand to help with his chainsaw.


The Architects of the Animal World
